*** The significant increase in first professional students and concurrent decline in graduate students is from a change in the reporting of Medical Residents. Medical Residents are now more accurately reported in the first professional category, rather than the master's degree category, as in previous years. For Fall 2003, this difference was 632 Medical Residents and Medical Fellows, and 37 Visiting Medical Trainees. Due to data conversion problems the university is unable to identify the remaining Masters and Doctoral students with complete accuracy. The university has one designation (GR) for both Masters and Doctoral students.**
